Petruska was a 2020 Women of Innovation® Finalist in the Small/Medium Business Innovation and Leadership category.

In her current role at Sonata Scientific, Petruska develops novel catalysts for air purification and self-disinfecting surfaces which can then be used in diverse ways to improve air quality, increase shelf life of fresh produce, and provide protection against surface-borne bacteria and viruses. She will share her diverse research experiences and scientific discoveries, as well as the lessons learned throughout her career that she uses to help young women navigate their own career paths.

Developing innovative material solutions to technical and environmental challenges has been a hallmark throughout her career. With a BS in chemistry from Carnegie Mellon and a PhD in chemistry from the University of Florida, Petruska is a co-author on 36 scientific publications and a co-inventor on 15 issued patents.



The webinar will be moderated by **Karen Buell**, a member of the Women of Innovation® committee and Connecticut Technology Council Board Member. Currently the VP of Operations at Payveris, Buell has 10+ years of experience in banking with a focus on customer facing technology, UI/UX and digital channels. Additionally, she is a Financial Peace University coordinator, devoting many hours to teaching financial literacy, and serves on the Houghton College MBA Advisory Council, Buell's alma mater.

science and technology professions throughout Connecticut. The awards program will also recognize outstanding young women at the high school and collegiate level pursuing technology studies. Nominations were reviewed by expert judges, and finalists are selected based on their professional experience, history of innovation, ability to think creatively and solve problems and demonstration of leadership. Student finalists were selected based on inventiveness and accomplishment in science and technology and academic achievement.

Nominations were accepted earlier this year in the following categories of Innovation and Leadership: Youth, Collegian, Secondary Academic, Postsecondary Academic, Research, Community, Entrepreneurial, Small Business, Medium Business and Large Business. An award will also be given for Inspiring STEM Equitability, presented to an individual for promoting equality and diversity in STEM.

The 17th annual Women of Innovation® awards program will be held as a virtual event on October 14 at 5:00 PM.
